Biography

Eighteen year-old, Mathieu Bois is part of the senior national team and is quickly climbing the ranks as one of Canada's top breaststrokes (Canadian ranking in the 100 meters breaststroke – 1st and in the 200 meters breaststroke – 2nd) while cutting a place among the best breaststrokes of the world (World ranking in the 100 meters breaststroke – 26th).

Bois has recently qualified in first place for the 100 meters breaststroke for the Pan American Games that will take place next July in Rio de Janeiro, in Brazil where he will be to look for in the breaststroke and QNI events.

In 2006, Bois has represented Canada while participating:

- to the Pan Pacific Games - Victoria, British Columbia;
- to the FINA World Short Course Championships - Shanghai, China;
- to the Commonwealth Games - Melbourne, Australia.

In 2005, Bois was part of the Junior squad that competed for Canada at the 2005 Junior Pan Pacific Games. Bois placed 7th in the 100 meters breaststroke and 4th in the Men's 4x100 medley relay.

Over the course of his career, Bois set 21 provincial records and 2 age-group national records in the 100 meters and 200 meters breaststroke, records previously held by Morgan Knage.

Mathieu Bois is currently studying at the Collège de Maisonneuve in Human Sciences with Mathematics and is training at the Multi Sport National Centre located at the Olympic Park Pools under the guidance of Paul Bergen and Benoît Lebrun.
